

Pastor has a favorite!

Sherry's "Question of the Month" for February is "What is your favorite Scripture / Bible passage?" Since my youth, mine has been:

Proverbs 3:5-6

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart,
and do not rely on your own insight (understanding).
In all your ways acknowledge him,
and he will make straight (direct) your paths."

I had been active in church since I was a little boy. And I had always believed wholeheartedly — in God and Jesus. But when I reached my teenage years, I fully realized that I needed to look — to God and our Lord for guidance in my life...and that I could!

My father told me to do like he did and "pull myself up by my own bootstraps". He said God made me, gave me a good body and mind, and expected me to use them as I went through life. Dad was right about that, and I thank God for my physical and mental health.

But I soon found that my own insights and understanding, as brilliant as they were (LOL!), were not enough. I needed wise, reliable, and trustworthy help and advice from a source outside of myself.

And I found it! I soon discovered that there are many people and groups "out there" in life who are very eager to give us advice. Unfortunately, they often have their own agendas and want to use us for their purposes and their best interests rather than ours. And with some of them, their interests are for our harm, rather than for our good!

But I also discovered that the Bible was right! (Imagine that!!) The Lord's insight and wisdom are far better than mine! And the Lord can be trusted. I learned that when I rely on the Lord and acknowledge him as my mentor and leader, my life goes much better and I am much stronger than when I rely on my own insight, understanding, and strength. I learned that when I let him lead and direct my life, my life's paths are straighter, more productive, and happier.

It's not easy to do...not all of the time. Putting all of our trust with all of our hearts in the Lord can be challenging, especially when the path ahead is not clearly marked or visible. And doing so does not mean that we'll never have problems or challenges. Far from it! But it does mean that the Lord will help us get through them...if we trust in him, rely on him, and let him lead us.

Many years have passed since I first adopted Proverbs 3:5-6 as my own personal Bible passage. And looking back on my life, I thank God for bringing this passage to me in my early days. As I reflect, I see that its truth has been realized in my life over and over again.


Music to our Ears!



- **Darlene Leach** Ephesians 5: 18-20, "Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." I try to remember to thank God for everything, the good and the not so good. Just because bad things happen, we have to remember that God has a plan for everything and everyone!
- Wendy Murphy Romans 8:36 is one of my favorites!!!
- Sherry Fowler Philippians 4:4, "Rejoice in the Lord, always. Again, I say Rejoice!"
- **Linda Leone** Luke 12:48, "But he who unknowingly committed acts worthy of punishment shall be beaten with few stripes. For to whom much is given, of him much shall be required. And from him to whom much was entrusted, much will be asked."
- **Bill Mariorenzi** Philippians 4:10-13, "I rejoice greatly in the Lord that at last you have renewed your concern for me. Indeed you have been concerned, but you had no opportunity to show it. I am not saying this because I am in need, for I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. I know what it is to be in need. And I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do everything through him who gives me strength." What it means to me first of all God is the giver of all things. Second, it is a process of learning if you will be content with what God allows you to have and be thankful to know the difference. Be grateful that he cares. He loves us.
- **Linda Armstrong** Romans 8:38-39 is ONE of my favorite Bible passages: "For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Laura Jordan - The first is Colossians 3: 23-24, "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving." - The second is Ephesians 6:1-18, "6 Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. ² "Honor your father and mother"—which is the first commandment with a promise—3 "so that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth." [a] ⁴ Fathers, [b] do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord. ⁵ Slaves, obey your earthly masters with respect and fear, and with sincerity of heart, just as you would obey Christ. 6 Obey them not only to win their favor when their eye is on you, but as slaves of Christ, doing the will of God from your heart. ⁷ Serve wholeheartedly, as if you were serving the Lord, not people, ⁸ because you know that the Lord will reward each one for whatever good they do, whether they are slave or free. ⁹ And masters, treat your slaves in the same way. Do not threaten them, since you know that he who is both their Master and yours is in heaven, and there is no favoritism with him. ¹⁰ Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. ¹¹ Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. ¹² For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. ¹³ Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. 14 Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, ¹⁵ and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. ¹⁶ In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. ¹⁷ Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. ¹⁸ And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people."

The March "QUESTION OF THE MONTH" will be "Have you witnessed a miracle?"




