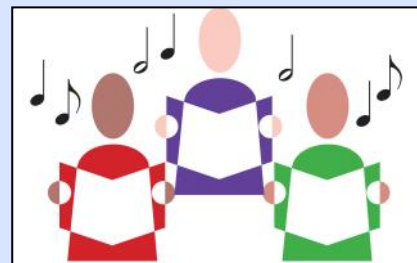
It takes the whole village (congregation) to praise our awesome God!

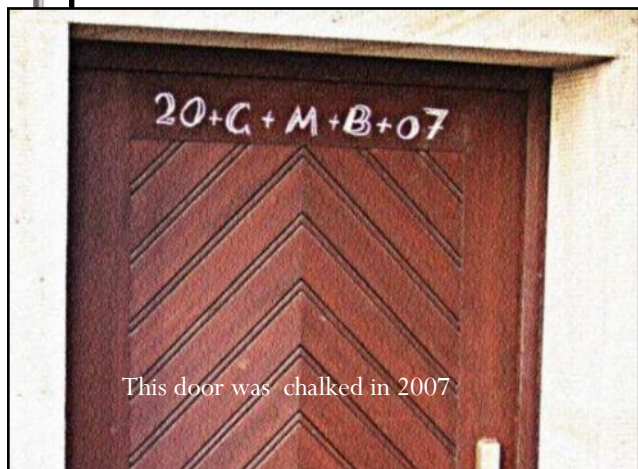

Chalking the Door for Epiphany



CHALK + BLESS YOUR HOME

FOR EPIPHANY - JANUARY 6

This Epiphany tradition is a way of blessing all who enter, exit, and dwell in your home or church. You simply write the number of the new year and the letters C, M, and B in chalk on the door or doorframe. The letters stand for the three traditional names of the Magi in Matthew 2: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. The letters can also be a Latin acronym for “May Christ bless this dwelling.”

CHALKING THE DOORS LITURGY FOR HOMES

Leader: Peace be to this home, and to all who enter here. All: Amen.

One or more of the following prayers may be said: May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus who is your incarnate Word, now and forever. Amen.

God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten One to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this home and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Savior. Amen.

Loving God, bless this household. May we be blessed with health, goodness of heart, gentleness, and abiding in your will. We ask this through Christ our Savior. Amen.

All may take turns chalking the door: 20 + C + M + B + 26 .

The three Wise Men, Caspar [C], Melchior [M], and Balthasar [B], followed the star to Bethlehem and the child Jesus 2000 [20] and 26 [26] years ago. [+ +]

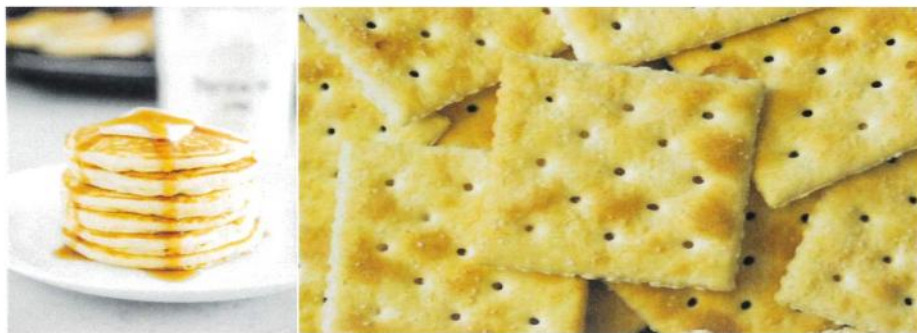

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

December 7, 2025

The annual congregational meeting was called to order by Council President Ada Arthur.

REPORTS:

- Ada Arthur gave an update on the call process for a new pastor. One of the requirements by Synod is that a 100-page document, must be completed by both membership and clergy before a call committee can be formed. The entire process from our present status, to forming a call committee and then Synod supplying us with the names of possible candidates could take up to three years. Ada asked that we continue to pray for MLLC during this period.
- A survey will be sent to all members after the first of the year. The purpose of the survey is to profile what MLLC is looking for in a pastor.
- Synod will meet in January 2026, for a council training day. Synod has asked MLLC to host this event and other area churches will be invited.
- Ada Arthur reported that she had contacted Post Partum, regarding the possibility of donating some money towards the use of MLLC facility. Following discussion and questions from the congregation, it was decided that council will continue to look into this matter, as there has been no resolution at the time of this meeting

BUDGET:

The main purpose of this meeting was to vote of the proposed 2026 budget.

Treasurer Brandt Armstrong and Peggy Oxendine have worked very hard to streamline next year's budget. Brandt went over the budget and explained where and why there are changes from the 2025 budget. Following this explanation, a motion by Sherry Fowler was made to accept the proposed budget. The motion was seconded by Wayne Rimer and the floor was open for discussion. Following discussion, there was a call for the vote.

The motion to accept the 2026 budget as proposed by council, was passed by a unanimous vote.

Pastor Kathleen Miko gave a blessing for our brunch and the meeting was adjourned.

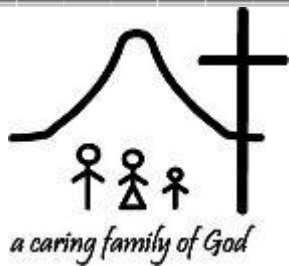
