

Colossians 3:23-24 (New English Translation)

What is stewardship? The dictionary defines it as the job of supervising or taking care of something such as an organization or property. A quick definition from Wikipedia will tell you: "Stewardship is a theological belief that humans are responsible for the world, humanity, and the gifts and resources that have been entrusted to us. Believers in stewardship are usually people who believe in one God who created the universe and all that are within it, also believing that they must take care of creation and look after it forever. Creation includes animals and the environment."

Well, we are those people who believe in the one God, creator of the universe. Paul writes to the Colossians (3:23-24): <sup>23</sup> Whatever you are doing, work at it with enthusiasm, as to the Lord and not for people, <sup>24</sup> because you know that you will receive your inheritance from the Lord as the reward. # WORSHIP SERVICE TIME CHANGE


Sunday, October 5, 2025

Let's explore something new together!






