
## Have you heard about the video series, "The Chosen"?

# Martin Luther Church is participating in a project sponsored by the Spiritual Support Outpost Network.



This project is called "The Veteran Suicide Awareness Tree" or

#### THE WITTING TREE.

November 1<sup>st</sup> – 11<sup>th</sup>, 2023

The Witting Tree is a silent, faith-filled witness observed each day for eleven days, from November 1 through November 11 (Veterans Day).

There is a deep need for our society as a whole to take responsibility to interrupt and transform destructive cycles that cost service people, their families, and the larger community so much.

The term "witting" means to be cognizant, deliberate, and aware to the facts of a situation. Each year, more than a dozen faith communities and organizations join in hosting a Witting Tree ceremony at their sites.

We will participate in the Witting Tree project by hanging 22 sets of dog tags each day on a tree in our church side yard (near our sign on Martello Drive) in public remembrance of 22 veterans who take their lives each day by suicide. (That is one Veteran that takes their life every 80 minutes.)

We would like each of our Veterans to participate in this project by taking a day to place the 22 dog tags on our designated Witting tree and saying a prayer.

#### **Among the saints**

In *God in the Moment*, Kathy Coffey retells the story of a priest who fielded this question: "How many people were at the early celebration of the Eucharist last Wednesday morning?" The priest replied, "There were three old ladies, the janitor, several thousand archangels, a large number of seraphim and several million of the triumphant saints of God." Coffey writes: "Such a 'cloud of witnesses' answers a deep human urge to be part of something larger, to not stand alone, to give our little lives meaning. One drop of water, left alone, evaporates quickly. But one drop of water in the immense sea endures."

#### **Searching for saints**

God is on a saint search, and it's not only perfect people who are going to be found. Sure, there may be some who are born with the natural ability to love the Lord with the totality of heart, soul, mind and strength, nonstop. But for most of us, this passion and power come only after we discover that God has always loved us, and that his love precedes our own.

Fact is, most of us find the Lord only after we have been found by him


And all God asks is that we respond with that same level of passion ... loving him with all our heart, soul, mind and strength ... and showing a willingness to love our neighbors as ourselves.






